Lincoln School, founded in 1884, was named to honor John Larkin Lincoln, a history professor at Brown University and early advocate for equality in the education of girls and young women.

The Center for Justice, Peace and Global Citizenship

The Center for Justice, Peace, and Global Citizenship drives critical reflection and engagement on all matters pertaining to diversity, inclusion, justice, multiculturalism, and global citizenship at Lincoln. The Center empowers the Lincoln School community to make positive and sustainable change, to ask the "difficult questions", to address implicit and explicit bias, and to do so with respect, regardless of ability, age, ethnicity, gender, race, religion, sexual orientation, or socioeconomic status.

The Center's interconnected web of student clubs and program days that address topics like racial justice, privilege, feminism, and intersectionality, support this important work.

Campus and Facilities

Lincoln School facilities are located on two separate campuses:

The Providence campus is at 301 Butler Avenue on the East Side of Providence, and is made up of Faxon Hall, the Dorothy Gifford Science Wing, the Paul and Ruth Levinger Dining Room, the Francis Wheeler Gymnasium, the Ebner, Elson, Hart Music Center, The STEAM Hub for Girls Art Gallery and classroom, Murray Middle School, the Lower School, the Little School, the Boss-McLoughlin Gymnasium, and Dwight House.

Lincoln's outdoor athletic facilities, located at Faxon Farm, 180 Danforth Street in Rehoboth, MA, features the Murray Family Athletic Complex, comprised of a state-of-the-art artificial turf field, two natural turf fields, and the Boss Family Tennis Center with six all-weather tennis courts. The site is also home to the Carriage House and Terrace, historic farmhouse, and barn.

Athletics (Go Lynx!)

Lincoln offers nine varsity sports in the Upper School and six in the Middle School. Grade 5 students are welcome to participate in soccer, field hockey and lacrosse. All game schedules can be found in the portal.

Lumina (and Little Lumina for Early Childhood)

Lumina is a beloved Lincoln tradition and community event prior to the December winter break, which includes silent meeting focusing on peace, humanity, and stewardship of the Earth with references to Lincoln's Quaker values. Students in Kindergarten–Grade 12 attend this event which includes a candlelight procession of Grade 12, handbells, and lots of music. On the morning of Lumina, the Early Childhood children attend Little Lumina, held in the Lower School Library.

The Rhode Island Festival of Children's Books and Authors

Not to be missed! This amazing family festival right on our campus is held annually the Saturday after Columbus Day weekend, which this year October 13.
